DEAN'S BIT — Henri Cardinal de Lubac SJ was one of the truly significant theologians of the twentieth century. He was praised by successive popes. One of his key contributions was to help us recover an early understanding of the relation between the Eucharist and the Church; he thought that his contemporaries had lost sight of the purpose for Christ's being really present in the Eucharist. Pope Paul VI summed it so: 'The church makes the Eucharist; and the Eucharist makes the church.' The primary purpose of the Eucharist is to make **us** the one body of Christ. St Augustine, in his *Confessions*, writes of the Body and Blood of Christ which we received: "You shall not change me into yourself as bodily food but you shall be changed into me".

Cardinal Ratzinger (as he was then) wrote of de Lubac's insight: the Mediaeval theologians saw was that there were two concepts intertwined: the mystical body (*corpus mysticum*) and the real body (*corpus verum*). For the mediaeval theologians the mystical body referred to the Body of Christ in the Eucharist because mystical meant that which pertained to mystery or sacrament. This mystical or sacramental body is given to us so that we may become the real Body of Christ. The Lord is present in mystery in the Eucharistic food so that we can really be his Body in the world.

In many ways, therefore, the high point of the Mass is when we receive the Body and Blood of Christ. After you receive Communion, it is good to pause at the mystery of the people around you and with you being formed into the Body of Christ through the gift of the Christ's Body and Blood. This is the wonder of the Eucharistic food. In one his sermons, St Augustine said: 'So if it's you that are the body of Christ and its members, it's the mystery meaning you that has been placed on the Lord's table; what you receive is the mystery that means you. It is to what you are that you reply Amen.'

Become what you receive: the Body of Christ. Amen.
