PLENARY COUNCIL PRAYER

Come, Holy Spirit of Pentecost. Come, Holy Spirit of the great South Land. O God, bless and unite all your people in Australia and guide us on the pilgrim way of the Plenary Council. Give us the grace to see your face in one another and to recognise Jesus, our companion on the road. Give us the courage to tell our stories and to speak boldly of your truth. Give us ears to listen humbly to each other and a discerning heart to hear what you are saying. Lead your Church into a hope-filled future, that we may give the joy of the Gospel.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord bread for the journey from age to age. **Amen**. *Our Lady Help of Christians, pray for us. Mary McKillop, pray for us.*

DEAN'S BIT – Welcome Fr Garner to the Cathedral parish. Fr Garner is being thrown in the deep end this weekend so please welcome him and show him the friendly face of our Cathedral parish.

I have been moved by the participation of the people in the Cathedral liturgies. At the heart of the life of the Cathedral community is the liturgy.

Active participation is, after all, at the heart of the liturgical reforms of the Second Vatican Council. At a General Audience on 17 March 1965, Pope Paul VI said:

We should not think that after a while there can be a return to the former, undisturbed devotion or apathy. No, the new way of doing things will have to be different; it will have to prevent and to shake up the passivity of the people present at Mass. Before, it was enough to assist; now, it is necessary to take part. Before, being there was enough; now, attention and activity are required. Before, everyone could doze or perhaps even chatter; now all must listen and pray.... The assembly becomes alive and active; taking part means allowing the soul to become attentive, to enter into the dialogue, to sing, to act. The unity of a community action, consisting not only of outward gestures but also of an inner movement of faith and devotion, invests the rite with a special power and beauty. The rite thereby becomes a chorus, a concert; it takes on the rhythm of giant wings, soaring toward the heights of joy and of the divine mysteries.

Soaring words from St Paul VI. I hope we shall all hear the clarion call to see ourselves as participants and not just bystanders at the liturgy. We are active participants - through bringing our prayers, joys, struggles to the Mass with hope in God who bends down to us so lovingly; through raising our voices in song and in the prayers of the Mass; through the humble confession of our sinfulness; through listening to the readings truly expecting God to speak to us today; through joining our prayers to the prayers spoken by the priest on our behalf and on behalf of the whole church; through moments of silent adoration of God because he is God; through the loving reverence through which we receive him in the Eucharist; through our attentiveness to the people around us for we are the Body of Christ; through the ministries we perform at Mass.

This is not a list to be checked off, but it is an invitation to consciously participate int every moment in the Mass.

May we all respond to the dialogue which is the liturgy; in this dialogue God speaks and listens to us, his holy people, the people he loves.

CANDLEMAS - on Saturday, 2 February at 8am Mass we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord or Candlemas. It is a tradition to bless candles at the Mass and you are welcome to bring your own candles to be blessed. Fr Sean will also be blessing our new votive candle stands.

PLENARY COUNCIL - Plenary Council Listening and Dialogue Sessions - we have four sessions planned at this point. Please do come to one. EVERYONE is welcome. It would be helpful if you could indicate on the sign-up sheet at the back of the church which session you will attend, but feel free to drop-in for one of the sessions. This is an opportunity to share what you think the God is asking of us in Australia; to participate in the process of listening to what the Spirit is saying about the future of the Church. It is an opportunity to contribute to the process. Please do not stay away because you think no one will listen to your thoughts; everything will be collated and sent to the Council. There will be refreshments too.
