DEAN'S BIT – This weekend our Archbishop is celebrating the 11am Mass; joining the normal congregation at this Mass will be Safeguarding Officers from across the Archdiocese. I would add my little welcome to that of the Archbishop. The Archbishop's initiative in establishing the Safeguarding Office under the direction of Andrea Musulin has put our Archdiocese at the forefront of organisations and churches building child-safe organisations. This is not a one-off project. We are seeking to make our parish communities welcoming and safe ones for the children and the vulnerable. The revelations, which are sadly so familiar to us, spur us on to make changes not just for the sake of children in the church, but for children in our society.

Pope Francis recently pointed out that abuse is a human problem everywhere. He went on to say, 'If we resolve the issue within the Church, we may be able to help solve it in society, in families. But firstly, we need to become conscious of it, have the protocols, and move forward.' Those words should inspire all of us to work hard to address the issue in the church so that we can help the broader society and our families address it. Just think of the suffering we can help prevent in our society, the suffering we can mitigate by our commitment as a church community to this work, to this path. The Australian bishops started to address the issue in the 1990s, but we all continue to learn, and this is not just a work for our bishops and for leaders of religious congregations; it is a work for all of us.

One of the initiatives promoted by the Safeguarding Office is the Helping Hand - helping your children identify 5 adults they would choose to go to if they felt unsafe. Importantly the adults must **be trustworthy, must listen and believe, must be available, and must take action**. It would be great if those qualities would characterise all of us as we seek to build safer communities for our children.

MASS FOR THE SICK - Saturday, 23 February the anointing of the sick will be celebrated within the **8am Mass**. The anointing of the sick is for those who are seriously affected by illness or the debilitating effects of age. The celebrant assisted by another priest will be present to minister the sacrament to those who come forward within the Mass. Please be aware that the 8am Mass that day will take somewhat longer than usual.

PLENARY COUNCIL - Plenary Council Listening and Dialogue Sessions - we have one session remaining which will be held Sunday 17th February after the 9.30am Mass. EVERYONE is welcome. This is an opportunity to share what you think the God is asking of us in Australia; to participate in the process of listening to what the Spirit is saying about the future of the Church. It is an opportunity to contribute to the process. Please do not stay away because you think no one will listen to your thoughts; everything will be collated and sent to the Council. There will be refreshments too.
