DEAN'S BIT - On Tuesday Jean Vanier, the founder of L'Arche died. L'Arche had simple beginnings. Jean, a Catholic layman, invited two men with intellectual disability to share a home with him. He named his house, L'Arche or Ark. Many people came to visit him and were inspired by his manner of life. L'Arche spread throughout the world including to Australia.

Jean Vanier had said of the mystery of L'Arche: "Living in community with people who have been very wounded, we touch our own brokenness, our own inner pain, our own anguishes, our own hardness of heart. Little by little, Jesus and the Holy Spirit are teaching us to open our hearts to all people and to discover that we are called to love the enemy. The fundamental mystery of L'Arche is that of belonging and of communion. It is to enter into communion with the poor. The heart of the mystery of the church is that she is essentially a place of communion. Little by little we are being called to that gift."

Jean Vanier was asked by the British journal, *The Tablet*, about death:

"When you die, you fall asleep. And you wake up, and there's a very gentle peace. You feel well. And then you discover the face of God coming through that 'wellness'. Of course, we are outside time, so it's not sequential. Seeing Jesus' face, we suddenly have a feeling of having hurt him – we realise we could have done much better, we've done wrong. We are not being judged, we judge ourselves. But then comes the realisation that we are loved just as we are, in our darkness. So there's a meeting with God, who loves us in our poverty – and this we can hardly believe. That meeting brings an immense desire to be closer. That desire becomes a place of desire – I think of Purgatory as 'the place of desire' – and it's painful. When you have desire and not the object of desire, it's very painful. But then the desire augments, and consequently the pain augments, until there is a moment of explosion, and then we're in communion with God."

May this tender friend of the Lord rest in peace.
