**DEAN'S BIT** – The news from Broome has come as a tremendous shock. Without passing any judgement on the matter, about which we do not have much information, it can sometimes feel that we are walking through an unending dark valley, but, as the psalmist reminds us, the Lord remains our shepherd even in these moments. People who have been terribly hurt and for whom the darkness is very intense have to be our focus as a community of reconciliation and faith. When we gather for Eucharist, it is Christ, the living centre, the heart of the church, who continues to gather us to feed us. Let us bring everything to him and ask him to make all of us ministers of his healing and new life.

Please take a look at the health measures below. At St Mary's we ask people who feel that they cannot receive Communion in the hand to please wait until all the faithful who are receiving in the hand are finished before they come up to the priest. The extraordinary ministers (including acolytes) may not give Communion on the tongue. Last week there was a bit of chaos at the Sunday evening Mass and I was not a great witness to charity and patience for which I apologise.

Please note the diocesan advice on the fulfilment of the Sunday and holyday obligation: If you are at particular risk from covid-19 you should take care to look after your health which may mean missing Mass; you are excused from your obligation. If you are ill, you should also stay away from Mass; illness excuses one from the normal obligation. It is also an act of charity towards other people.

**REMINDER OF HEALTH MEASURES IN EFFECT AT ST MARY'S AND IN THE PERTH ARCHDIOCESE**

For the comfort of all:

- The baptismal font and holy water stoups will remain empty
- The chalice will not be ministered to other ministers and the congregation at holy communion
- There will not be the sign of peace at Mass
- Extraordinary ministers are asked to cleanse their hands with the provided sanitiser before and after distributing Communion.
- Please receive Communion in the hand because receiving Communion on the tongue increases the risk to other members of the community.

**CONGREGATIONAL AWARENESS AND FULFILMENT OF THE NORMAL OBLIGATION:**

1. Parishioners who feel unwell should not attend Mass, and are excused from their normal obligation.
2. Parishioners who feel they may be at risk of infection if they go to Mass should refrain from attending Mass and are excused their normal obligation.
3. Priests and parishioners who attend Mass should practice good hygiene (cover mouths and noses when sneezing, coughing etc), refrain from touching their face or mouth, and refrain from shaking hands with others before or after Mass.
