Introductory Verse

Scripture

Christ suffered for you and left an example for you to follow the way he took. He had not done anything wrong, and there had been no perjury in his mouth. He was insulted and did not retaliate with insults; when he was tortured he made no threats but he put his trust in the righteous judge. He was bearing our faults in his own body on the cross, so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness; through his wounds you have been healed.

A period of silence may be observed after the scripture reading.

Short Responsory

In place of the short responsory the following antiphon is said:

(Ant.) Christ humbled himself for us and, in obedience, accepted death, even death on a cross.

He puts forth his arm in strength and scatters the proud-hearted. He casts the mighty from their thrones and raises the lowly.

He fills the starving with good things, sends the rich away empty.

He protects Israel, his servant, the mercy promised to our fathers, remembering his mercy, to Abraham and his sons for ever.
