CONGRATULATIONS TO THE SISTERS OF MERCY AND TO MERCEDES COLLEGE as we celebrate the beginning of Mercy education in Australia.

In 1846 Mother Ursula Frayne and her companions began teaching girls in the Swan River colony, laying the foundations of Mercedes College, the first Mercy school in this land. Mother Ursula Frayne came here in response to Bishop Brady's tale that there were 4 000 children needing a Catholic education in the colony. When the sisters arrived in Perth, their arrival was unexpected and no arrangements for sleeping quarters had been made. To quote Mother Ursula Frayne: "We stood in the wilds of Australia on that mid-summer night, and we could truly say with our Divine Model, we have nowhere to rest our head". Mother Ursula Frayne opened the school on 2 February 1846 with planks, bricks and packing cases as the furniture. One child turned up! This did not discourage them; however, they began house to house visits. After a lot of work, they had 50 children in their school and by 23 August 1846 they had 100 children. We give thanks for the faith and courage of the first sisters and all who followed in their footsteps.
