<u>DEAN'S BIT</u> — 'Peace is possible. Peace is the only way. Democracy is the only light to that path' is how Cardinal Bo, the Archbishop of Yangon, Myanmar, ends a moving letter to the people of his country, Myanmar, and the international community. We, who live in a functioning democracy, take certain rights for granted, including the right to vote, but we cannot be indifferent to the plight of others. According to some reports, fewer than half the human family live in democracies. The news carries stories of diminishing of freedoms all over the world, from Hong Kong to Nicaragua to Congo-Brazzaville. In many countries the Church, our brother and sister Catholics, are part of the struggle for democracy and freedom. We can support them with our prayers. Psalm 10 gives us words to pray on their behalf:

O LORD, why do you stand afar off, and hide yourself in times of distress?

The poor are devoured by the pride of the wicked; they are caught in the schemes that others have made....

O LORD, you have heard the desire of the poor. You strengthen their hearts; you turn your ear
to give right judgment for the orphan and oppressed, so that no one on earth may strike terror again.

We can also ask our government to speak up for the oppressed. We can use our imagination, resources and
resolve to work with others. And we can take support Project Compassion. The projects Caritas and its partner
create and support all over the world empower families, communities. They enable people to work together, to
educate their children, to survive and more. 'When the dignity of the human person is respected, and his or her
rights recognized and guaranteed, creativity and interdependence thrive, and the creativity of the human
personality is released through actions that further the common good.' (Pope Francis)

ASH WEDNESDAY AND LENT - This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday which marks the beginning of the season of Lent. There is Mass with the imposition of ashes at the Cathedral at 8 am, 12.10 pm and 6.30 pm; and at All Saints Chapel at 12.10 pm. Ash Wednesday is a day of abstinence and fasting. Abstinence in Catholic practice is to refrain from eating meat. Fasting means having only one full meal on a day. Smaller quantities of food may be eaten at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at any other time during the day. The law of fasting applies to people from 18 to 59 years old. Everyone aged 14 years and older is bound by the law of abstinence from meat. The Stations of the Cross are celebrated in the Cathedral every Friday of Lent at 5.30 pm
