the bearer of a unique mystery that can only be brought to light with the help of a father who respects that child's freedom. A father who realizes that he is most a father and educator at the point when he becomes "useless", when he sees that his child has become independent and can walk the paths of life unaccompanied. When he becomes like Joseph, who always knew that his child was not his own but had merely been entrusted to his care. In the end, this is what Jesus would have us understand when he says: "Call no man your father on earth, for you have one Father, who is in heaven" (Mt 23:9).

CHRISM MASS - The Annual Chrism Mass will be celebrated in the Cathedral on Tuesday 30 March at 7pm, by Archbishop Costelloe with the priests of the Archdiocese concelebrating. At the Mass the oil of the sick and the oil of catechumens are blessed; the oil of sacred chrism is consecrated. The bishops and priests also renew their commitment to priestly service. There are restrictions on the numbers who can participate in the Mass this year. Once our numbers are filled, we shall not be able to accept further registration. Entry to the Mass will only be for those who have registered. We are sorry that we are not able to throw open the doors as we have done in the past, but we are still under covid-19 restrictions. We are grateful that we are able to celebrate the Chrism Mass this year after the cancellation of last year's Mass.
