<u>DEAN'S BIT</u> – We have just celebrated Passion Week and the Easter Triduum, the feasts towards which we are journeying in Lent. We are now in the Easter season which does not have the same type of focus as Lent. We had penances to do in Lent; what do we do in Easter? This is a season of hope and joy for the Lord has risen. Maybe one thing we can do is to read the resurrection appearances of the Lord. The Lord appears to console his disciples, that is to fill them with faith, hope and love. We can pray for that consolation before we read one of the Resurrection appearances in the Bible. My favourite is John's story of Jesus' appearing to Mary Magdalene. Imaging the images, emotions of the disciples. Talk to the Risen Lord. Ask him to give us the gift of Easter hope and joy. Rejoice in this season. Say, sing, shout 'Alleluia'!

THREE CHRISTIANS The news had saturation coverage of the death of the Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh. I am sure we all feel deeply for the Queen who has lost someone on whom she has leant these many years. The former Archbishop of Canterbury, Rowan Williams, said that 'it was a very terrifying experience' to preach in front of Prince Philip: 'He made it very clear what he thought a good sermon required and what it didn't require, and it certainly didn't require more than eight minutes in delivery.' The duke would listen carefully to the sermon and argue points with the preacher afterwards!

On 10 April Edward Idris Cardinal Cassidy AC died. It was not a death which figured as prominently in the press. Cardinal Cassidy had been a Vatican diplomat and eventually became head of the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity. He was a quiet, unassuming man. Someone referred to him as 'the quiet ecumenist'. He was born and died in New South Wales.

And finally, on 6 April Prof. Hans Küng shuffled off this mortal coil. Küng was an immensely influential theologian. In the 60s Küng brought a young Fr Joseph Ratzinger into the theology faculty at Tübingen. He reached a large audience with his writing. Küng's theology became controversial and in 1979, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith revoked his faculty to teach as a Catholic theologian. Cardinal Kasper, a famous theologian, said that, 'Last summer I phoned the pontiff to tell him that Küng was near death and wanted to die at peace with the church. Pope Francis told me to pass on his greetings and his blessing.' 'Certainly, the theological differences remained and were not resolved,' but 'on a pastoral and human level, there was a reconciliation.'

Three very different men (sorry for the lack of diversity), but all three were Christians committed to their faith. May they rest in peace.
