DEAN'S BIT When last I looked at the World Health Organisation's covid-19 dashboard, the number of confirmed cases of covid-19 in India was 2 646 526 and that was just the figures from a seven-day period. The number of deaths over that same period was 25 514. Next in this ranking of misery is Brazil with 414 123 cases and 16 842 deaths over the period. The figures are awful enough, but many informed commentators are saying these numbers do not reflect the true tragedy. We have glimpsed something of the calamity on our television screens and there are members of our community who will be suffering with and grieving for family members. The Western Australian bishops together with their Metropolitan, our Archbishop, will be praying for the sick, suffering and dead of covid-19 at the 11am Mass. May this act of communion with our brothers and sisters awaken a sense of solidarity in all of us. We are in this together. We need to challenge our government when it acts in such a way as to harm this cohesion.

While one community in our world is wracked by this disease, we cannot rest in the illusion that we are safe. According to Bloomberg as of 5 May, 1.19 billion doses of covid-19 vaccines have been delivered. The wealthiest countries have dispensed 35.9% of the vaccine doses yet only have 10.5% of the population. We need to turn our eyes to our brothers and sisters in misery and need. Let us urge our political leaders to do all they can to support suffering communities, to help with the distribution of vaccines. Let us support organisations involved in this worthy work. The Holy Father put a challenge to all of us, to pharmaceutical companies and governments: *"We can't put ourselves before others, putting market forces and patent laws before the laws of love and the health of humanity."*

VALE LINDSAY EVANS It's with a great deal of sadness that we share the very sad news of the passing away of our beloved bell-ringer Lindsay Evans. Lindsay has been the bell-ringer here at St Mary's Cathedral for around 30 years and a parishioner for many decades.

A person of great integrity and quiet, strong faith which was reflected in many ways – including in his dedication to the Cathedral through his bell-ringing – rain hail or shine, Lindsay was here each Sun morning for many years ringing for Our Lord and his Blessed Mother.

Lindsay was an amazing member of our Music Programme who particularly admired the work of the Cathedral Choir and our Cathedral musicians – always supportive and delighted with the progress and accomplishments of our younger musicians.

We will miss his dedication, his absolutely infectious smile and personality, his wit and inimitable sense of humour and the wonderful support and friendship he gave all of us – thank you so much Lindsay. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord and may perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace. Amen
