DEAN'S BIT This weekend the Archbishop celebrates the Opening Mass of the Plenary Council. The covid-delayed and long-awaited Council begins its work in earnest. The Council itself may make important decisions, recommendations or even make law for the church in Australia (all subject to the approval of the Holy See), but I think it also marks a shift in the way we do things as church in the modern era. Councils, synods have been a part of church life for centuries, only fading from view in the late nineteenth century. Apart from ecumenical councils, they tended to be very much the preserve of the ordained. Obviously, the bishops of a church have an integral role in teaching and governance, a role which they have as part of the church's divinely-ordained structure, but the manner in which that role has been exercised has developed over the millenia. I think, and these are my thoughts only, we are moving to a way of exercising ministry which involve listening to a wider range of voices; it also calls on us to be people of discernment, listening for the still, small voice of the Spirit who speaks to us through the voices and encounters which we have. But enough of my thoughts, the Council, if it is to bear its fruit, needs to be led by the Spirit and so let us pray for the Council in earnest, for all the members of the Council that they have the freedom to attend to the Spirit of God whose ways are not our ways.
