ASH WEDNESDAY AND LENT This Wednesday, 2 March, is Ash Wednesday which marks the beginning of the season of Lent. There is Mass with the imposition of ashes at the Cathedral at 8am, 12.10pm and 6pm; and at All Saints Chapel at 12:10pm.

Ash Wednesday is a day of abstinence and fasting. Abstinence in Catholic practice is to refrain from eating meat. Fasting means having only one full meal on a day. Smaller quantities of food may be eaten at two other meals but no food should be consumed at any other time during the day.

The law of fasting applies to people from 18 to 59 years old. Everyone aged 14 years and older is bound by the law of abstinence from meat. The Stations of the Cross are celebrated in the Cathedral every Friday of Lent at 5.30pm.
