**DEAN'S BIT** On Friday the Holy Father consecrated Russia and Ukraine to the Blessed Virgin Mary and in this he was joined by our Archbishop and bishops throughout the world. The prayer is extraordinarily moving and I include the last two paragraphs here so that you can join in and also make the prayer your own:

Therefore, Mother of God and our Mother, to your Immaculate Heart we solemnly entrust and consecrate ourselves, the Church and all humanity, especially Russia and Ukraine. Accept this act that we carry out with confidence and love. Grant that war may end and peace spread throughout the world. The "Fiat" that arose from your heart opened the doors of history to the Prince of Peace. We trust that, through your heart, peace will dawn once more. To you we consecrate the future of the whole human family, the needs and expectations of every people, the anxieties and hopes of the world.

Through your intercession, may God's mercy be poured out on the earth and the gentle rhythm of peace return to mark our days. Our Lady of the "Fiat," on whom the Holy Spirit descended, restore among us the harmony that comes from God. May you, our "living fountain of hope," water the dryness of our hearts. In your womb Jesus took flesh; help us to foster the growth of communion. You once trod the streets of our world; lead us now on the paths of peace.

Amen.

Obviously this prayer focuses on peace in Ukraine, but it invites us all to turn to the Lord that he may water the dryness of our hearts. It invites us to call on Mary that our mother may help us all to foster communion and love in our midst where there is so much division.



THE CROSS is the sign of God's love for us, a love which is triumphant at Easter. The children of our parish are invited to take one of the wooden crosses which are available opposite the baptism area at the back of the Cathedral. You can help your children to craft/paint or draw on the wooden cross and bring
