INTRODUCING Imported from an archipelagic country in Southeast Asia officially known as The Republic of the Philippines which consists of about 7,107 islands in high tide and 7,640 islands when low tide, the name is **Israel Quirit**. I'm the youngest of four children and became an altar server at a tender age of twelve. Mum was the inspiration of my faith and soon after I became a member of the Legion of Mary. Growing up in a shanty town, life was difficult. It was by the grace of God that I was able to finish high school and was studying electrical engineering for six months before leaving home at fifteen to join a religious community in Cebu, the oldest city in the country. I was under formation for three years before being invited to study at St. Charles' Seminary in Perth in 2008, but it was in 2013 that I discerned and decided to join the diocesan priesthood. After my priesthood ordination in 2015, I was an assistant priest at St. Andrew's parish in Clarkson for two years and at St. Mary of the Cross MacKillop in Ballajura for a year. After which, I was assigned to be a priest in residence at St. Charles' Seminary in Guildford in 2018 while waiting to finish my master's degree in Philosophy at the University of Notre Dame Fremantle. In 2021 I was appointed Vocations Director in the Archdiocese of Perth before getting an appointment to join the clergy team here at St. Mary's Cathedral. I thank you for your warm welcome and I look forward to serving you all while growing and gaining experience in my ministry in the process. As a wise priest used to say, "bloom wherever you are planted!" I believe that with your prayers and support, together we can bloom from each other's blessings.



THE CROSS is the sign of God's love for us, a love which is triumphant at Easter.
