DEAN'S BIT William O'Malley SJ, a renowned church historian has a written a concise history of the Second Vatican Council and lists the shifts which the Council brought about: from commands to invitations, from laws to ideals, from threats to persuasion, from coercion to conscience, from monologue to dialogue, from ruling to serving, from withdrawn to integrated, from vertical and top-down to horizontal, from exclusion to inclusion, from hostility to friendship, from static to changing, from passive acceptance to active engagement, from prescriptive to principled, from defined to open-ended, from behaviour-modification to conversion of heart, from the dictates of law to the dictates of conscience, from external conformity to the joyful pursuit of holiness.

It is quite a list. What sticks out for you? The final two struck me - from the dictates of law to the dictates of conscience, from external conformity to the joyful pursuit of holiness — because, I think, the Archbishop is inviting us to that sort of conversion as we think about the Sunday obligation.
