DEAN'S BIT The final session of the Second Vatican Council was held in 1965, but the reception of the teachings of that great council continues to this day. The spirit of the Council continues to inspire and be argued about. I think that the direction and teaching of Pope Francis is very much in the spirit of the Council. The Plenary Council which we have just had is not as momentous an event as the Second Vatican Council, but its decrees too have to be received by the local church; the Spirit who was at work in the Plenary Council continues to blow through our land. The Holy Father's response to the decrees of the Council will be key for the synodal journey is always *cum Petro et sub Petro*, always with Peter and under Peter, for, as the Second Vatican Council taught, the pope is 'the perpetual and visible source and foundation of the unity both of the bishops and of the whole company of the faithful'. Still in some sense the reception of the Council's decrees is already underway; we do not what the end of this particular journey will be. How will diocesan pastoral councils function? What will Laudato Si' action plans and ecologically-converted parishes and communities look like? When will we get a new translation of the Missal? What is the significance of the Plenary Council's endorsement of the Uluru Statement from the Heart for the way we engage in politics? Just some questions which we can discuss and on which we can reflect. There are many more. We live in exciting times!
