**DEAN** I extend the thanks of the Cathedral priests to all the parishioners who have been so generous to us over Christmas. Thank you to all those left cards, presents and best wishes for us. Thank you too to those who have been so generous with their time and talents over the Christmas period. So many people volunteered to prepare and beautify the Cathedral and to serve the Christmas liturgies behind the scenes, on the sanctuary and in the choir loft. We would not have had the beautiful Masses we had without our generous volunteers and ministers. Be assured of our prayers for you and your families.

A new year begins with the celebration of the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. It is also the World Day of Peace, which, though, a Catholic commemoration, is truly for all the world. Every year the popes have released a message for the World Day of Peace and this year Pope Francis reflects on the covid-19 pandemic and the war in Ukraine. He reflects that the pandemic exposed our fragility and our need for one another; the war is 'reaping innocent victims and spreading insecurity'. He writes that 'while a vaccine has been found for Covid-19, suitable solutions have not yet been found for the war. Certainly, the virus of war is more difficult to overcome than the viruses that compromise our bodies, because it comes, not from outside of us, but from within the human heart corrupted by sin.' As we reflect on this where does it lead us?

First of all, to let our hearts be changed by our experience of the crisis, to let God, at this time in history, transform our customary criteria for viewing the world around us. We can no longer think exclusively of carving out space for our personal or national interests; instead, we must think in terms of the common good, recognizing that we belong to a greater community, and opening our minds and hearts to universal human fraternity. We cannot continue to focus simply on preserving ourselves; rather, the time has come for all of us to endeavour to heal our society and our planet, to lay the foundations for a more just and peaceful world, and to commit ourselves seriously to pursuing a good that is truly common.

Mary, our Mother, who pondered on the Word of God can help us on our journey to a conversion of mind and heart. Like her, let us ponder the Word of God in prayer; let it sink into our minds and hearts and, through the
