DEAN As a Cathedral community we have been united with Catholics throughout the world in praying for Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI. The Archbishop is celebrating a memorial Mass for Benedict at 11am this Sunday. Pope Benedict wrote three encyclicals on love and hope; a fourth on faith was completed by Pope Francis. They are sublime reflections on the theological virtues. Spe Salvi, the encyclical on hope, can give us food for meditation as we pray for the repose of Benedict XVI. In one section he reflects on purgatory and frames it in terms of encounter with Christ:

The encounter with him is the decisive act of judgement. Before his gaze all falsehood melts away. This encounter with him, as it burns us, transforms and frees us, allowing us to become truly ourselves. All that we build during our lives can prove to be mere straw, pure bluster, and it collapses. Yet in the pain of this encounter, when the impurity and sickness of our lives become evident to us, there lies salvation. His gaze, the touch of his heart heals us through an undeniably painful transformation "as through fire". But it is a blessed pain, in which the holy power of his love sears through us like a flame, enabling us to become totally ourselves and thus totally of God.... The transforming "moment" of this encounter eludes earthly time-reckoning—it is the heart's time, it is the time of "passage" to communion with God in the Body of Christ. Pope Benedict also offered an image to counter more static visions of eternal life: It would be like plunging into the ocean of infinite love, a moment in which time—the before and after—no longer exists. We can only attempt to grasp the idea that such a moment is life in the full sense, a plunging ever anew into the vastness of being, in

which we are simply overwhelmed with joy. And finally he encourages us to pray for those who have died: my gratitude to the other—my prayer for him—can play a small part in his purification. And a final word of hope that our prayer for one who has died is never too late for it is never too late to touch the heart of another, nor is it ever in vain. May Joseph Ratzinger in the encounter with Christ become totally Joseph Ratzinger and thus totally of God.
