

DEAN'S BIT The Holy Father has been in the news again – the press pack do look forward to their conversations on the plane with him! In this case, Pope Francis has re-stated – though with a firmness lacking in previous language – that homosexuality is not a crime and countries should not criminalise homosexual behaviour or relationships. He called on the world's bishops to work for an end to criminal penalties. Pope Francis went on to have an imaginary conversation with someone who responded, 'But it is a sin.' And he said that sinfulness and crime should not be conflated. He then said something which has been important for his ponficate and that of his predecessor, 'It's also a sin to lack charity with one another.' Love is what is important. We can prioritise all sorts of other things in looking at our lives and those of others and we, Catholics, have tended to focus on sexual sins, but love or charity is the keystone.

2023 PARISH ANTI-SLAVERY CAMPAIGN During this year St Mary's Cathedral is partnering with the WA Catholic Migrant and Refugee Office (WACMRO) to highlight modern slavery practices and ensure that the Cathedral parish commits to fair trade products and services in its supply lines. We will be signing an In-Principle Agreement with WACMRO to kick off the year long education and action campaign and to commemorate the life of St Bakhita (the patron saint of modern slavery). Do join us for a sausage sizzle after the 5:00 pm Mass this Saturday. All are welcome.

ST JOSEPHINE BAKHITA, also known as 'Mother Moretta' was kidnapped at the age of nine and sold into slavery. Such was the trauma experienced that she forgot her birth name and her kidnappers gave her the name Bakhita meaning 'fortunate'. Flogging and maltreatment were part of her daily life. She experienced the moral and physical humiliations associated with slavery. It was only in 1882 that her suffering was alleviated after she was bought for the Italian Consul. This event was to transform her life. In this family and, subsequently in a second Italian home, she received from her masters, kindness, respect, peace and joy.

A change in her owner's circumstances meant that she was entrusted to the Canossian Sisters and her next fifty years were spent witnessing God's love through cooking, sewing, embroidery and attending to the door. She was a source of encouragement and her constant smile won people's hearts, as did her humility and simplicity.
