

OUR NEW ICONS

Fr Richard Charwood, a Ukrainian Catholic priest, who is creating our icons has written a short explanation of the icons which are in our Blessed Sacrament Chapel:

The three (of seven) icons that have been installed in the Cathedral make up a traditional iconic representation known as the Deisis. This Greek word means "prayer" or "intercession." The Mother of God and John the Baptist, also known as the Precursor, stand either side of Christ with hands in the attitude of supplication towards the Risen Lord. They were the first witnesses of the manifestation of the divinity of Christ and stand either side of Him to act as intermediaries; praying for the salvation of our souls and for the mercy of God.

Traditionally, Christ would be seated in majesty, holding a book in one hand, with the other hand raised in blessing. The space did not allow for this, so Christ is depicted as the risen One; His wounded hands raised in prayer for us all.

The Greek letters either side of Christ are an abbreviation of "Jesus Christ." The Greek letters beside Mary are an abbreviation of "Mother of God." The Greek letters to the right of John the Baptist say "The Precursor."
