#### MESSAGE FROM THE DEAN

How does the church remain faithful to the Gospel over the centuries? She does so by returning to the sources of her life again and again. These sources are the Scriptures, the sacraments and the early church Fathers. The first few centuries were a period of incredible fertility for the church, a time when great scholars and saints like Chrysostom, Augustine, Hilary developed the language which we still draw on today.

This return to the sources gave rise to the incredible newness of the Second Vatican Council. It will, I am sure, shape the reflections of the upcoming assembly of the Synod of Bishops. They will draw on our rich and diverse tradition to respond to the questions and challenges of our own day, but this does not mean that they will simply repeat the answers of the past; this living memory and present questions will come together to bring about something new. We do not need to fear such newness for it has been part of the church since the beginning. The Nicene Creed, which took hundreds of years to develop, was considered too radical and new for many at different periods of its development! Now we cannot imagine anything more traditional.

Yves Congar OP, the great theologian, wrote that 'Tradition is memory, and memory enriches experience. If we remembered nothing it would be impossible to advance; the same would be true if we were bound to a slavish imitation of the past.' He used another image: we cannot move forward if we keep both feet on the ground or lifted both in the air. To move forward we must push off from the ground with one foot on the ground and the other in the air. A good image of the dynamism of tradition; it grounds us enabling us to move forward. I find the change the synod represents challenging, but I do not fear it. I invite you to look forward prayerfully with hope. We are also called to do in a personal way what the church does. We are called to keep returning to Christ in the Scriptures and the sacraments. The compassionate Lord we encounter there enables us to respond with faithful compassion to the new questions which life throws at us.
