OUR MISSION

<u>Dean's bit</u>

We have our blinkers. I would say that all of us have our blinkers. The challenge of discipleship is to continually listen to the voice of Spirit who speaks to us through the Word of God – the Scriptures, the living Tradition of the church including its teaching – and our neighbour, especially in the unexpected voice which intrudes on our ease. The Spirit does not magically free us from our blindness, but slowly patiently moves with us a step at a time on the journey. The Spirit does not force us to change, she only invites us to change. We can ask the Spirit to give the desire and grace to change our minds and hearts so that we grow freer in Christ.

I was reflecting on this after reading an article by a fellow parish priest on the church's social justice teaching - one of the Catholic Church's best kept secrets! We have a tradition of papal teaching on social justice issues which goes back to Leo XIII's 1891 encyclical, Rerum Novarum which addressed the changing labour conditions of the age. The latest additions to this rich tradition are Fratelli Tutti and Laudato Si' of Pope Francis which challenge our growing apathy to human suffering and our failure to address global warming. These are big issues and it is easy to think, 'what can I do?' Why make ourselves miserable about things we can do nothing about? But there are decisions we can all make. For example, the parish is committed to the modern slavery project. Modern slavery is worldwide problem, but we can make a difference by becoming ethical consumers, choosing fairtrade goods.

We also live in a democracy and so play a role in the direction of our government; we make choices when we vote. Do we allow Catholic social teaching to challenge and invite us. Catholic social teaching does not tell us how to vote and there can be many ways of building a more just society; we can disagree on what a more just society will look like and how to get there, but Catholic social teaching opens our eyes to the issues at play and invites us to reflect and act prayerfully and with faith, hope and love.

On Tuesday, 15 August, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary which is a holy day of obligation.
