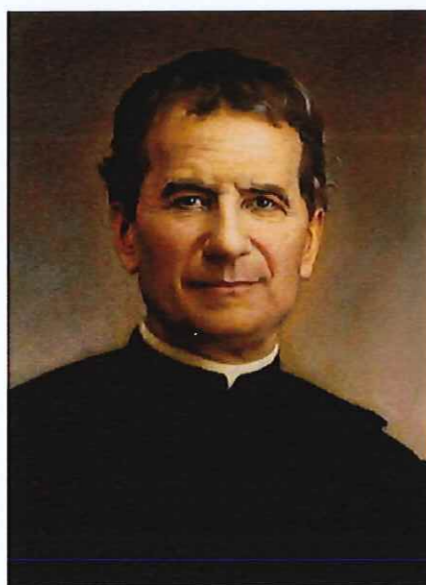

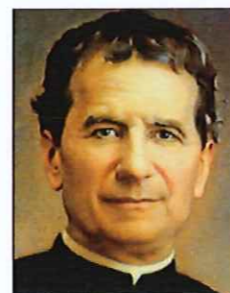

**The Icons at St Mary's Cathedral**

The final four icons have now been hung either side of the Deisis. (Christ, Mary and John the Baptist) St Peter stands to the right of St John; his hand raised in blessing. In his other hand is a scroll reminding us of the scriptures. St Benedict of Nursia stands to the right of St Peter. His presence is a reminder of the Benedictine connection with the Cathedral. On his scroll is a quote from his Rule, "Listen and attend with the ear of your heart." St Paul stands to the left of the Mother of God, holding a copy of the Scriptures. To his left stands St Mary of the Cross (Mackillop) who, unlike the other saints, looks out at us directly. Her invitation to us is that, "We must teach more by example than by word." This is a quote of hers from 1867.

A warm welcome to the Salesians to the Cathedral. The Salesians were founded by don Bosco and this year we celebrate the centenary of the arrival of the Salesian order in Australia: a small group of Salesians, including one bishop, five priests and three brothers, arrived at the Port of Fremantle and were welcomed by the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, who provided them with hospitality until they set forth on the final stage of their long journey from Turin in Northern Italy to the Kimberley region of Western Australia. These Salesians had responded to a call from the Holy See to come to Australia to care for the indigenous population of the North-West. The Salesians had the care of parishes in Perth, but no longer. Of course we continue to be blessed with a Salesian presence in Perth in the person of our Archbishop!
