

Dean's Bit

The Australian bishops have issued a statement of principles

on the use of Inclusive language in the liturgy. This is very

- "ensure that each person hears the texts as being addressed to them;
- "facilitate the full, conscious and active participation of all those gathered."

The translation of the bible which we use for our readings is the Jerusalem Bible which was published in 1966. Several more accurate translations have come out since. The bishops have approved two new translations to supplement the 1966 translation. They are the Revised New Jerusalem Bible and the New Revised Standard Version. So what will this mean? You may notice that what you hear at Mass may be different from the text in your Missal, e.g. they ask us to "substitute exclusive terms with appropriate inclusive expressions when proclaiming the readings from the Lectionary. For example, replace 'brothers' with 'brothers and sisters' or 'friends' when it is used in the letters of St Paul to address the listeners. When referring to all people, replace 'men' or 'mankind' with 'humanity', 'humankind', 'others' or 'people'." Priests are asked to look at the readings beforehand and use an alternative reading when the current lectionary uses exclusive language. The readings themselves have not changed just the translation from the original Hebrew and Greek. May it encourage all of us to listen attentively to what God is saying to us through his Word.
